**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF MIRAMAR, FLORIDA,
AUTHORIZING THE CITY ATTORNEY TO FILE A LAWSUIT
AGAINST VIGIL INC. AND OR VIGIL/FOXCONN FOR
BREACH OF CONTRACT AND ANY OTHER APPLICABLE
CLAIM ARISING FROM ITS FAILURE TO DELIVER AN
ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE WEAPONS DETECTION
SECURITY SYSTEM; AND PROVIDING FOR AN
EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, the Miramar Police Department (“Department”) entered into an agreement with Vigil Inc. (“Vigil”) for the purchase of VIGIL/FOXCONN TrueShield Gen4 AI Station Metal Detectors (“metal detectors”) for a total contract amount of \$74,787.50; and

WHEREAS, on July 1, 2024, the Department issued a fifty percent (50%) deposit in the amount of \$37,393.75 from funds allocated from the City’s Law Enforcement Trust (“LETf”);

WHEREAS, despite multiple assurances and scheduled delivery timelines, the project experienced significant delays, which have persisted for over a year, and Vigil has not provided any definitive timeline for delivery of the metal detectors or resolution;

WHEREAS, given Vigil’s failure to deliver the metal detectors and lack of a clear resolution, the City Commission deems it to be in the best interest of the citizens and residents of the City of Miramar to file a lawsuit to pursue the return of the deposit.

Section 4. That this resolution shall be effective upon Commission adoption.
