RE: Temp. Reso. No. 8612 authorizing the expenditure of \$15,000 of Law Enforcement Trust Funds which will be utilized to defray the cost of protracted or complex investigations

RECOMMENDATION: The City Manager recommends approval of Temp. Reso. No. 8612, authorizing the expenditure of \$15,000 in Law Enforcement Trust funds (“LETf”), which will be utilized to defray the cost of protracted or complex investigations.

ISSUE: All use of LETf requires the Chief of Police to bring the expenditure before the Commission. The aforementioned expenditure is permitted under Florida Statute (“F.S.”) §932.7055, which governs the use of LETf.

BACKGROUND: Some investigations require more time and resources than others, which is why Florida State Statutes allow the use of LETf to offset some of the costs associated with the investigation. Some of these costs could include payments to confidential informants and/or additional expertise.

DISCUSSION: A transfer will be processed to move \$15,000 from the Appropriate Fund Balance Account #160-20-000-521-000-609990-93200 to the Confidential Informant Account #160-20-00-521-603502-93200 in support of the Strategic Investigations Unit.

ANALYSIS: F.S. §932.7055, allows for the expenditure of LETf to defray the cost of protracted or complex investigations.

WHEREAS, criminal investigations vary in complexity, necessary resources, and time required for completion; and

WHEREAS, the Miramar Police Department is committed to providing thorough investigations of criminal activity even when those investigations require confidential informants or additional financial resources to keep the community safe; and

WHEREAS, Section 932.7055, Florida State Statutes, allows for the expenditure of Law Enforcement Trust Funds ("LETf") to defray costs related to protracted or complex investigations; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police certifies that the expenditure of \$15,000 in LETf to fund complex investigations complies with Section 932.7055, Florida State Statutes, in that the funds were not considered in the adoption and approval of the Police Department's budget; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police certifies that the expenditure of \$15,000 in State LETf complies with Section 932.7055, Florida Statutes, in that the funds are not being used as a normal source of revenue for the Police Department; and
