RE: Temp. Reso. No. 8752 supporting the City of Pembroke Pines' application for funding from the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization's Roads for Economic Vitality Program, Cycle 1 for the proposed project – Pembroke Road from Flamingo Road to Hiatus Road

RECOMMENDATION: The City Manager recommends approval of Temp. Reso. No. 8752, supporting the City of Pembroke Pines' application for funding from the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization's ("MPO") Roads for Economic Vitality Program ("REV") Cycle 1 for the proposed project – Pembroke Road from Flamingo Road to Hiatus Road.

ISSUE: The Broward MPO requires cities to adopt a resolution expressing support for proposed project being requested for funding from the REV Cycle 1.

BACKGROUND: The City of Pembroke Pines seeks to submit an application for funding from the Broward MPO REV Cycle 1 for the proposed project below:

Pembroke Road From Flamingo Road to Hiatus Road Improvements: Milling and resurfacing of Pembroke Road to facilitate 6' wide buffered bike lane between Flamingo Road and Hiatus Road. Project also includes minor pavement reconstruction, new signing and pavement markings, and the construction of new curb ramps to comply with ADA requirements.

This project will continue the City's ongoing efforts for complete streets improvements within its rights-of-way.

The MPO requires a resolution of support from the City of Miramar for the project because the southern half of the project falls within the jurisdictional boundaries of the City of Miramar.

DISCUSSION: The MPO's REV provides funding for small local transportation projects that will improve the safety and mobility for all transportation users in Broward. This competitive grant program can fund projects such as (but not limited to): complete streets projects, traffic calming and intersection improvements, ADA upgrades, mobility hubs, bus shelters, bike racks and technology advancements such as transit signal priority and traffic control devices.

The REV program will be administered via the Local Agency Program ("LAP") structure with municipalities funding upfront costs for Design, Construction and Construction Engineering Inspection ("CEI") services to be then reimbursed on a quarterly frequency, by entering into a LAP agreement. Agencies will also be required to program funds for any contingencies in excess from the awarded amount.

ANALYSIS: The City of Pembroke Pines, as the applicant, has committed to upfront the project costs. There will be no fiscal impact to the City of Miramar.

WHEREAS, a resolution from the City of Miramar Commission stating support for the project is required to establish funding eligibility; and

WHEREAS, federally funded projects off the state highway system are delivered using the federally mandated Local Agency Program (“LAP”) process; and

WHEREAS, the City of Miramar endorses the City of Pembroke Pines to administer and deliver the project listed in Exhibit “A” under LAP; and

WHEREAS, the LAP program is reimbursement based as specified in the LAP agreement; and

WHEREAS, the City of Pembroke Pines will determine any required funding commitments for the upfront costs for design, Construction Engineering and Inspection (“CEI”) services, and construction to be then reimbursed as per the LAP agreement; and

WHEREAS, the City of Pembroke Pines will determine any required funding commitments for construction contingency per the requirements of LAP; and

WHEREAS, the City of Pembroke Pines will be solely responsible for any required funding commitments required for the project per the requirements of LAP; and

WHEREAS, the project listed in Exhibit “A” will be constructed within City’s right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the City of Miramar, to maintain or coordinate the maintenance of the roadways after the project’s completion; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager recommends that the City express its support for the project listed in Exhibit “A” and commits to administer and deliver the projects listed under the LAP process.

Section 5: The City of Miramar is responsible to maintain or coordinate the maintenance of the improvements after the project’s completion.

Section 6: That the appropriate City Officials are authorized to do all things necessary and expedient to carry out the aims of this Resolution.

Section 7: That this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
