RECOMMENDATION: The Interim City Manager recommends approval of Temp. Ord. No. 1702, adopting the Ad Valorem Tax Rate for Fiscal Year 2019 ("FY19").

ISSUE: This Ordinance adopts the Ad Valorem Millage Rate for FY19. The Ad Valorem tax revenue in the FY19 annual budget is based on this millage rate. The amount budgeted is \$67,793,000, which is \$7,133,900 greater than the previous year.

BACKGROUND: In accordance with Chapter 200.065, Florida Statutes, a taxing authority is required to adopt a final budget and adopt a Resolution or Ordinance stating the millage rate to be levied. The Resolution or Ordinance shall state the percent, if any, by which the millage rate to be levied exceeds the rolled-back rate. The adoption of the budget and the millage levy Resolution or Ordinance shall be approved by separate votes. The millage levy shall be publicly read in full prior to its adoption. In no event may the millage rate adopted exceed the millage rate tentatively adopted.

The Ad Valorem millage rate for Tax Year 2018 is 7.1172 mills, or \$7.1172 per thousand dollars of taxable assessed property value. This number is 11.82% greater than the rolled-back rate per state law, which is 6.3651 mills.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIRAMAR, FLORIDA, ESTABLISHING AND ADOPTING THE CITY OF MIRAMAR AD VALOREM TAX OPERATING MILLAGE LEVY RATE AT 7.1172 MILLS, OR \$7.1172 PER THOUSAND DOLLARS OF TAXABLE ASSESSED PROPERTY VALUE FOR THE 2018 TAX YEAR, WHICH IS 11.82% GREATER THAN THE ROLLED-BACK RATE OF 6.3651 MILLS; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Commission and the City Administration of the City of Miramar have reviewed the 2019 Fiscal Year ("FY19") Budget for the various operating departments of the City and the means of financing said budget; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission has determined that a millage rate of 7.1172 is necessary to fund the FY19 Budget; and

WHEREAS, all public notice and hearings required by Chapter 200.065, Florida Statutes have occurred.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIRAMAR, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>: That it establishes and adopts the City of Miramar Ad Valorem Tax Operating Millage Levy Rate of 7.1172 mills for the 2018 tax year, or \$7.1172 per thousand dollars of taxable assessed property value. This millage rate is 11.82% greater than the rolled-back rate of 6.3651 mills.
