TO 1735 - Annual Update of the Capital Improvements Schedule of the Capital Improvements Element of the City's Adopted Comprehensive Plan

**RECOMMENDATION:** That, pursuant to Section 163.3177(3)(b), Florida Statutes ("F.S."), the City Commission reviews the proposed annual update to the Schedule of Capital Improvements or Capital Improvements Plan ("CIP"), as found in "Table 6.1: Capital Improvement Needs Identified in the Comprehensive Plan" in the Capital Improvements Element ("CIE") to account for Fiscal Years 2020 through 2024, for consistency with the goals, objectives and policies of the CIE and other Elements of the City Comprehensive Plan; considers the recommendation by the City Manager and the Planning and Zoning Board, and any testimony at the public hearing; and adopts the proposed update by passage of the attached ordinance.

**ISSUE:** Section 163.3177(3)(b), F.S., mandates that the City reviews the Schedule of Capital Improvements of the CIE on an annual basis and further provides that any related update or modification may be accomplished by an ordinance of the City Commission. Pursuant to Section 163.3174, F.S., and Section 107 of the City Land Development Code ("LDC"), the CIP update was reviewed and unanimously recommended for adoption by the Planning and Zoning Board, sitting as the local planning agency, at its regularly scheduled meeting on November 12, 2019. The update is now being placed on this City Commission meeting agenda for final consideration and adoption.

**BACKGROUND:** Pursuant to Section 163.3177, F.S., the CIE of the City Comprehensive Plan is designed to consider the need for and location of public facilities necessary to achieve and maintain the City's adopted Level of Service ("LOS") standards. In accordance with these requirements, the CIP acts as a financial plan outlining proposed capital expenditures to be incurred each year over a period of five years, which are necessary to correct existing deficiencies, replace obsolete public facilities and accommodate future growth at the adopted LOS standards. The statute also calls for an annual update to the CIP, which may be accomplished by ordinance and is not deemed to be an amendment to the City Comprehensive Plan.

Pursuant to Policy 1.1 of Objective 1 of the CIE, the adopted 2020 City budget includes an updated CIP with a five-year plan expenditure projection for projects necessary to ensure that the adopted LOS standards are achieved and maintained for FY 2020-2024. In compliance with state law, the proposed ordinance will update the CIE, more specifically the Schedule of Capital Improvements found in "Table 6.1: Capital Improvement Needs Identified in the Comprehensive Plan" to reflect the City's latest adopted CIP.

WHEREAS, in 2005, the Florida Legislature passed Senate Bill 360 a/k/a Chapter 2005-290, Laws of Florida, which required, in part, that local governments annually update the Capital Improvements Element contained in their Comprehensive Plans in order to ensure that the required level of service standard for the public facilities listed in Section 163.3180, Florida Statutes ("F.S."), is achieved and maintained over the next five years; and

WHEREAS, Section 163.3177(3)(b), F.S. requires local government to annually review and update the Capital Improvements Schedule of the Capital Improvements Element of their Comprehensive Plan, and further provides that modification to update the Five-Year Capital Improvements Schedule may be accomplished by ordinance; and

**WHEREAS**, the adopted City of Miramar ("City") Comprehensive Plan includes a Ord. No. \_\_\_\_

Capital Improvements Element designed to consider the need for and the location of public facilities in order to encourage the efficient use of such facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Capital Improvements Element of the City Comprehensive Plan includes a Capital Improvements Schedule in Table 6.1, which consists of any publicly funded projects of federal, state, or City, and which may include privately funded projects for which the City has no fiscal responsibility; and

WHEREAS, the Capital Improvements Schedule identifies those projects, which are necessary to ensure that the level-of-service standards adopted by the City for concurrency-related facilities are achieved and maintained for the five-year period as either funded or unfunded and given a level of priority for funding; and

WHEREAS, Policy 1.1 of Objective 1 of the Capital Improvements Element of the City Comprehensive Plan mandates that, as part of the annual budgetary process, the City also adopt an updated Capital Improvement Program Document with a five-year plan expenditure projection for projects necessary to ensure that the adopted level-of-service standards are achieved and maintained; and

WHEREAS, as part of the budgetary process for Fiscal Year 2020, the City has adopted a new Five-Year Capital Improvement Program Document for Fiscal Years 2020 to 2024, by passage of Resolution No. 19-174; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 163.3177(3)(b), F.S., and Policy 1.1 of Objective 1 of the Capital Improvements Element of the City Comprehensive Plan, the City wishes to update the Capital Improvements Schedule set forth in its Comprehensive Plan, by deleting and replacing the Capital Improvements Schedule for Fiscal Years 2019 to 2023,

appended as Exhibit "B"; with a new Capital Improvements Schedule for Fiscal Years 2020 through 2024, also attached as Exhibit "A", to ensure consistency with the newly adopted Capital Improvement Program Document for Fiscal Years 2020 to 2024; and

WHEREAS, after a duly advertised meeting held on November 12, 2019, the Planning and Zoning Board, sitting as the Local Planning Agency, has found that the proposed update of the Capital Improvements Schedule, Table 6.1 in the Capital Improvements Element, provided for in this Ordinance, is internally consistent with the City Comprehensive Plan and has recommended its adoption; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager recommends adoption of the proposed update of the Capital Improvements Schedule, Table 6.1 in the Capital Improvements Element of the City Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, after a duly advertised meeting, the City Commission finds it to be in the best interest of the citizens and residents of the City of Miramar to adopt the proposed update of the Capital Improvements Schedule, Table 6.1 of the Capital Improvements Element of the City of Miramar Comprehensive Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIRAMAR, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>: Recitals. That the foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are made a specific part of this ordinance.

Section 2: Capital Improvements Schedule Is Internally Consistent with Comprehensive Plan. That the City Commission finds the annual update of the Capital Improvements Schedule for Fiscal Years 2020 through 2024 of the Capital Improvements Ord. No. \_\_\_\_ 3

Element to be internally consistent with the City of Miramar Comprehensive Plan.

Section 3: Projects Listed in the Capital Improvements Schedule. The Capital Improvements Schedule for Fiscal Years 2020 through 2024: (1) includes all publicly funded projects of federal, state, or City, as well as privately funded projects, if any, for which the City has no fiscal responsibility; and (2) identifies those projects, which are necessary to ensure that any adopted level-of-service standards are achieved and maintained for the five-year period as either funded or unfunded and given a level of priority for funding.

<u>Section 4</u>: Capital Improvements Schedule Adoption. That the Capital Improvements Schedule for Fiscal Years 2020 through 2024, appended hereto as Exhibit "A", is incorporated herein by this reference and hereby adopted, pursuant to Section 163.3177(3)(b), F.S., and Policy 1.1 of Objective 1 of the Capital Improvements Element of the City of Miramar Comprehensive Plan.

Section 5: Deletion of Capital Improvements Schedule for Fiscal Years 2019 through 2023. That the Capital Improvements Schedule for Fiscal Years 2019 through 2023, appended as Exhibit "B", is incorporated herein by this reference and is hereby deleted from Table 6.1 of the Capital Improvements Element of the City of Miramar Comprehensive.

Section 6: Inclusion of Capital Improvements Schedule for Fiscal Years 2020 through 2024. That the Capital Improvements Schedule for Fiscal Years 2019 through 2023, appended as Exhibit "A", is hereby included in Table 6.1 of the Capital Improvements Element of the City of Miramar Comprehensive Plan.

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**Section 7**: **Scrivener's Error.** The City Attorney is hereby authorized to

correct scrivener's errors found in this Ordinance by filing a corrected copy with the City

Clerk.
