Agreements with Broward County concerning the distribution of proceeds

of Broward County local option gas taxes

RECOMMENDATION: The City Manager recommends adoption of Temp. Reso. No. 7395 approving the proposed annual amendments to the three existing local option gas tax Interlocal Agreements ("ILAs") with Broward County.

ISSUE: Broward County requires City Commission approval of annual amendments to the local option gas tax ILAs.

BACKGROUND: The City and Broward County have entered into three ILAs for the division and distribution of the proceeds of the local option gas taxes imposed by Broward County. The three ILAs include:

1) The "original" local option gas tax adopted in 1983 and renewed in 1988, and last renewed in 2018 provides for cities throughout Broward County to receive 37.5 percent of the proceeds of six cents of gas tax. The six cent "original" local option gas tax was renewed in 2018 for a period of 30 years from FY19 to FY48 and will be administratevely updated to adjust for each City's percentage share of the population figures. Therefore, only the updated population and distribution figures are attached for the six cent "original" local option taxes in this FY2021 agreement approval process.

- 2) There was a separate and "additional" local option gas tax adopted in 1993, which provides for Broward County cities to receive 51.27 percent of three cents of gas tax. The agreement for the "additional" local option gas tax expires in 2024.
- 3) There was a separate "transit gas tax" adopted in 2000, which provides for Broward County cities to receive 26 percent of the proceeds of one cent of gas tax. The agreement for the "transit gas tax" expires in 2031.

The three ILAs require annual adjustment of the division and distribution of the proceeds based upon the population of the individual municipalities and unincorporated Broward County in accordance with the population figures set forth in the most current edition of "Florida Estimates of Population," published by the Bureau of Economics and Business Research, Population Division, University of Florida ("BEBR Figures"). The current BEBR Figures are as of March 22, 2021.

The amendment to the "additional" local option gas tax agreement accomplish the following:

- The 2021 amendment to the six cent "original" local option gas tax agreeement adjusts each City's percentage share of the 37.5 percent based on the City's population increase from 138,837 to 138,873. The City of Miramar's portion of the 37.5 percent decreased from 2.733959 to 2.716839 percent due to adjustments in population of various cities within the county. Please note that the City of Miramar's population increased 0.0259 percent from last year's estimate, as compared to the 1.2618 percent increase from the previous year.
- The 2021 amendment to the three cent "additional" local option gas tax agreement provides that the cities' share remain at 51.27 percent. Each City's percentage share of the 51.27 percent is also adjusted based on updated population figures. Accordingly, the City of Miramar's share decreased from 3.737869 to 3.714462 percent due to small population adjustments across Broward County.

The 2021 amendment to the one cent "transit gas tax" includes adjustments to each City's percentage share based on updated population figures, with no change in the 26 percent city share. The City of Miramar's share decreased from 1.895545 to 1.883675 percent due to small population adjustments within Broward County.

It is estimated that the FY 2022 revenue generated from these local option gas taxes will total approximately \$2,200,000, including \$1,300,000 that will be eligible for use for street and roadway maintenance and \$900,000 that will be eligible for use in capital improvements or related debt service for street and roadway capital projects.

<u>DISCUSSION</u>: Annual renewal of the Interlocal Agreement which includes a One, Three and Six cents local option gas tax for the purpose of Capital Improvement Projects, Debt Service and Street and Roadway maintenance.

ANALYSIS: The acceptance of the three interlocal Agreements between the City of Miramar and Broward County.

WHEREAS, the City of Miramar and Broward County have entered into three Interlocal Agreements (the "ILAs") providing for the division and distribution of the proceeds of the local option gas taxes imposed by Broward County by ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the original six cent local option gas adopted in 1983, renewed in 1988 and 2018, provides for Broward County cities to receive 37.5 percent of a six cent gas tax; and will be updated administratively by Broward County for 2021; and

WHEREAS, the additional local option gas tax adopted in 1993 provides for Broward County cities to receive 51.27 percent of a three cent gas tax; and

WHEREAS, the transit gas tax adopted in 2000 provides for Broward County cities to receive 26 percent of the proceeds of a one cent gas tax; and

WHEREAS, the distribution of local option gas taxes as provided for by the ILAs are based on population figures published annually by the University of Florida Bureau of

Economics and Business Research ("BEBR"); and

WHEREAS, the ILAs authorize the annual revision of city shares in the local option gas tax proceeds based on the most current published population numbers; and

WHEREAS, the City's population has increased from 138,837 to 138,873; and

WHEREAS, the County's population has also increased, creating the need to adjust its cities' shares of the local option gas tax proceeds; and

WHEREAS, the proposed 2021 amendments to the existing ILAs (the "Amendments") adjust the City's share of the local option gas tax proceeds based on the population increases in the City and in Broward County; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager recommends approval of the Amendments in the form attached hereto as Exhibits "A," "B" and "C"; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission deems it to be in the best interest of the citizens and the residents of the City of Miramar to amend the three existing Interlocal Agreements with Broward County for the division and distribution of the proceeds of the local option gas taxes imposed by Broward County, in the forms attached hereto as Exhibits "A," "B" and "C".

This 2021 Amendment to Interlocal Agreement ("2021 Amendment") is entered into by and between Broward County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida ("County"), and the municipalities executing a signature page bearing the above legend, each of which is a municipal corporation existing under the laws of the State of Florida, (each a "Municipality" and, collectively "Municipalities"). County and Municipalities are collectively referred to as the "Parties."

RECITALS

- A. Section 336.025(1)(b), Florida Statutes, authorizes the County to extend the levy of the additional three-cent local option gas tax upon every gallon of motor fuel sold in Broward County for a period not to exceed thirty (30) years on a majority vote of the governing body of the County.
- B. The Broward County Board of County Commissioners enacted Section 31½-38, Broward County Code of Ordinances, effective January 1, 1994, through December 31, 2024, pursuant to Section 336.025(1)(b), Florida Statutes, imposing the levy of the three-cent (\$.03) local option fuel tax for thirty (30) years and providing for a method of distribution of the proceeds of the tax.
- C. The method for distribution of the proceeds is established by an Interlocal Agreement with Municipalities representing a majority of the population of the incorporated area within the County ("Interlocal Agreement").
- D. Paragraph 3 of the Interlocal Agreement requires annual adjustment of the division and distribution of the proceeds based upon the population of the individual Municipalities and unincorporated Broward County in accordance with the population figures set forth in the most current edition of "Florida Estimates of Population," published by the Bureau of Economics and Business Research, Population Division, University of Florida ("BEBR Figures").
- E. Due to the delay in finalizing the decennial census numbers, the Parties must utilize the BEBR Figures available as of March 22, 2021, which have not been updated to include the decennial census numbers.
- NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, and pursuant to the authorization of Section 336.025(1)(b)2., Florida Statutes, the County and Municipalities agree as follows:
- 1. Paragraph 2 of the Interlocal Agreement, as previously amended, is hereby amended to read:
 - 2. Forty-eight and Seventy-three One-hundredths percent (48.73%) of the

total proceeds from the additional three-cent local option fuel tax shall be divided and distributed to the County, and the remaining Fifty-one and Twenty-seven One-hundredths percent (51.27%) of the total proceeds from the additional three-cent local option fuel tax shall be divided among and distributed to the eligible municipalities within the County as follows:

- 2. Paragraph 3 of the Interlocal Agreement, as previously amended, is hereby amended to read:
 - 3. The population figures set out herein are based on the figures contained in the document referred to as the "Florida Estimates of Population," published on an annual basis by the Bureau of Economics and Business Research, Population Division, University of Florida available as of March 22, 2021, attach hereto as **Exhibit A**. The population figures to be utilized in the formula described in Paragraph 2 of this Interlocal Agreement for the division and distribution of the proceeds from the additional three-cent local option fuel tax shall be adjusted annually based on the then-current "Florida Estimates of Population."

- 3. This 2021 Amendment shall be effective as of the date it is executed by the County after having previously been executed by Municipalities cumulatively representing a majority of the incorporated area population of the County. The amended population figures and share of proceeds shall take effect as provided by applicable law.
- 4. In the event any provision within this 2021 Amendment is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the remaining provisions shall continue to be effective unless the County or any executing Municipality necessary to maintain the cumulative majority referenced in the preceding paragraph elects to terminate the Interlocal Agreement. The election to terminate pursuant to this provision must be made within seven (7) days after such court ruling; provided, however, that if a timely notice appealing the court ruling is filed, the election shall be held in abeyance until the appeal is determined or dismissed.
- 5. Except to the extent amended, the Interlocal Agreement shall remain in full force and effect. In the event of any conflict between the terms of this 2021 Amendment and the Interlocal Agreement, as previously amended, the Parties acknowledge that this 2021 Amendment shall control.
- 6. This 2021 Amendment may be executed in several counterparts, each of which so executed shall be deemed to be an original, and such counterparts together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

This 2021 Amendment to Interlocal Agreement ("2021 Amendment") is entered into by and between Broward County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida ("County"), and the municipalities executing a signature page bearing the above legend, each of which is a municipal corporation existing under the laws of the State of Florida (each a "Municipality" and, collectively "Municipalities") County and Municipalities are collectively referred to as the "Parties."

RECITALS

- A. Section 336.025(1)(b), Florida Statutes, authorizes the counties to extend the levy of the additional fifth-cent local option gas tax upon every gallon of motor fuel sold in Broward County for a period not to exceed thirty (30) years on a majority vote of the governing body of the County.
- B. On June 13, 2000, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners enacted Ordinance No. 2000-25, effective January 1, 2001, through December 31, 2031, pursuant to Section 336.025(1)(b), Florida Statutes, extending the levy of the additional fifth-cent local option gas tax for thirty (30) years and providing for a method of distribution of the proceeds of the tax.
- C. The method for distribution of the proceeds is established by an Interlocal Agreement with Municipalities representing a majority of the population of the incorporated area within the County ("Interlocal Agreement").
- D. Paragraph 4 of the Interlocal Agreement requires annual adjustment of the division and distribution of the proceeds based upon the population of the individual Municipalities and unincorporated Broward County utilizing the population figures set forth in the most current edition of "Florida Estimates of Population," published by the Bureau of Economics and Business Research, Population Division, University of Florida ("BEBR Figures").
- E. Due to the delay in finalizing the decennial census numbers, the Parties must utilize the BEBR Figures available as of March 22, 2021, which have not been updated to include the decennial census numbers.
- NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, and pursuant to Section 336.025(1)(b), Florida Statutes, the County and Municipalities agree as follows:
- 1. Section 2.1 of the Interlocal Agreement, as previously amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

2.1 Seventy-four percent (74%) of the total proceeds from the additional fifth-cent local option gas tax shall be distributed to the County. The remaining twenty-six percent (26%) shall be distributed to the eligible municipalities in the County as follows:

The population figures set forth above are based on the figures contained in the document referred to as the "Florida Estimates of Population," published on an annual basis by the Bureau of Economic and Business Research, Population Division, of the University of Florida available as of March 22, 2021, attach hereto as **Exhibit A**. The population figures to be utilized in the formula described in this section for the distribution of the additional fifth-cent local option gas tax shall be adjusted annually based on the current Florida Estimates of Population.

- 2. This 2021 Amendment shall be effective as of the date it is executed by the County after having previously been executed by the Municipalities cumulatively representing a majority of the incorporated area population of the County. The amended population figures and share of proceeds shall take effect as provided by applicable law.
- 3. In the event any provision within this 2021 Amendment is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the remaining provisions shall continue to be effective unless the County or any executing Municipality necessary to maintain the cumulative majority referenced in the preceding paragraph elects to terminate the Interlocal Agreement. The election to terminate pursuant to this provision must be made within seven (7) days after such court ruling; provided, however, that if a timely notice appealing the court ruling is filed, the election shall be held in abeyance until the appeal is determined or dismissed.
- 4. Except to the extent amended, the Interlocal Agreement shall remain in full force and effect. In the event of any conflict between the terms of this 2021 Amendment and the Interlocal Agreement, as previously amended, the Parties acknowledge that this 2021 Amendment shall control.
- 5. This 2021 Amendment may be executed in several counterparts, each of which so executed shall be deemed to be an original, and such counterparts together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

Attached are the amendments to two interlocal gas tax agreements requiring approval by your municipal governing board no later than June 1, 2021. The two attached amendments for those gas tax agreements are required to adjust each City's percentage share based on updated population figures until they expire in 2024 and 2031. As a reminder, the "Original" Six Cents Local Option Gas Tax was renewed in 2018 for a period of 30 years from FY19-FY48. The updated BEBR population figures and the share of proceeds for FY22 are attached for your information.

Summary of Amendments

The two interlocal agreements and amendments are described below:

- The "additional" local option gas tax agreement levied in 1994 provides for Cities to receive 51.27% of three cents of gas tax. The Cities' share of this gas tax has increased over the years due to annexations, however, there were no annexations of populated areas effective September 2020 so the Cities' share of the three cents of gas tax will remain the same as last year. As a result, this amendment adjusts each City's percentage share of the 51.27% based on updated population figures.
- The "transit gas tax" agreement levied in 2001 provides for Cities to receive 26% of the proceeds of one cent of gas tax. This amendment includes adjustments to each City's percentage share based on updated population figures.

Revisions to Population Figures

The two interlocal agreements provide for the distribution of gas taxes among the Cities based on population figures published annually by the University of Florida Bureau of Economics and Business Research. The interlocal agreements also provide for the population numbers to be revised annually using the most current published figures.

Please place the two amendments on the agenda for approval by the municipal governing board as soon as possible and <u>return the signed</u> <u>agreement and a copy of your municipal resolution</u> to the County no later than June 1, 2021. This year we are accepting verifiable digital signatures, available through programs like DocuSign and Adobe. Once we receive a majority of signed agreements from the cities, our County Attorney's office will execute the agreements and return an executed complete document which includes the agreement, county signature page and city signature pages for your records.
