RE: FIRST READING of Temp. Ord. No. 1775 authorizing Juneteenth Day

RECOMMENDATION: The City Manager recommends approval of Temp. Ord. No. 1775, approving and authorizing the execution of the proposed new paid Holiday, Juneteenth Day.

ISSUE: Currently the City does not recognize June 19th (Juneteenth) as an observed, paid holiday. City Commission approval is required to amend the City Code to include Juneteenth as an observed paid holiday. In addition, staff desires to update Washington's birthday to be called President's Day.

<u>BACKGROUND</u>: Chapter 16 of the Civil Service Rules, Article XV, Holidays and Leave Time, Section 16-343 Holidays, stipulates that employees shall be eligible for scheduled paid holidays. When a holiday falls on a Saturday, the previous Friday will be observed, and if the holiday falls on a Sunday, the following Monday will be observed. The current paid holidays are:

½ New Year's Eve Day
New Year's Day
½ Christmas Eve Day
Christmas Day
Washington's Birthday
Independence Day
Martin Luther King Day
Thanksgiving Day
Friday following (Thanksgiving Day)

Veteran's Day Columbus Day Memorial Day Labor Day <u>DISCUSSION</u>: Juneteenth celebrates the emancipation of African Americans who were enslaved in the United States. Throughout the United States, the holiday is celebrated annually on June 19th. The estimated cost of implementing the new paid holiday is approximately \$103,000 per year. This includes wages and FICA (Federal Insurance Contributions Act). This will be an annual and recurring expense for the city.

Any conflicts with an existing Collective Bargaining Agreement will be discussed with each union.

ANALYSIS: Staff conducted a cost analysis regarding the historical average of the holiday pay spent through the current thirteen holidays. Other cities that have implemented Juneteenth as a holiday are: City of Dania Beach, City of Deerfield Beach, Miami Dade County, City of Tamarac and City of West Park. Additionally, most cities have updated the holiday name from Washington's Birthday to President's Day.
